Historical January Holidays Around the World

A new year is here, but celebrating the changing of the calendar isn't the only thing that is worthy of note in January. While turning over a new year is important (and you can see examples of these festivities in the <u>January 2022 issue</u>), there's more to help us get through the winter. So, as we do in the SCA, let's see what was done in the past...

Twelfth Night - Many events use this name, but what does it mean? As it says in the song "The 12 Days of Christmas" (although it's post-period, from 1780), there were (and for some, still are) twelve days of Christmas. December 25 was only the beginning of the holiday, with Twelfth Night at the end. The following day is Epiphany; said to be the day that the three wise men visited baby Jesus. Twelfth Night was a time of merriment and mischief, when things were turned upside down before getting serious again the next day. A king/queen of misrule was determined via right of cake - whoever found the dried bean or pea in the cake became ruler for the night. People might also go wassailing, going door to door with mulled cider or wine to wish good health to their neighbors.

Kakizome - This Japanese holiday is celebrated around or on January

2. The name means "first writing", and recognizes the first calligraphy of the new year. Ink would be made with the first water drawn from the well, and writers would scribe poems composed of words that would bring positivity. The poems would be burned a few weeks later as the writers eagerly watched - how high their burning poem sailed indicated how attractive their calligraphy hand would be.

Lohri - Is a holiday celebrated in northern India and marks the end of winter with the arrival of longer days. It falls on January 13 because it is held at the end of the month of the winter solstice. The lunisolar nature of the Punjabi calendar puts this into January. Traditionally, bonfires were lit and people danced and sang together. The folk hero Dulla Bhatti is often featured in these songs, which are performed by children who go around singing in exchange for treats. Lohri is also associated with the winter crop season.

Historical January Holidays - continued

Berchtoldstag - Celebrated in Switzerland and Liechtenstein, Berchtoldstag is of unknown origin. There are many theories, ranging from celebrating a 12th century. Duke's hunting trip, to honoring Perchta, the leader of the wild hunt. Whatever the source, on or around January 2 celebrants hold feasts. Nuts are associated with the holiday, both eaten and used for games. In some areas, parades are held where masked participants wish good luck to anyone they meet. They may be dressed as holly, a straw man, a snail shell, or others.

Makar Sankranti - A Hindu observance that is known by many names and marks the transition from Sagittarius (dhanu) to Capricorn (makara - the "makar" in the holiday's name). "Sankranti" means the movement of the zodiac from one sign to the next. Makar Sankranti is dedicated to the solar deity Surya and represents a new beginning as winter is ebbing away. It is celebrated over 4 days, around January 13-16. Practices include decorating cattle then leading them on a procession. At the end, they jump over fire, as a form of protection against evil and to symbolize the bonds between the human and natural worlds. Today, many also fly kites and eat sesame treats.

1.) How did you find your way to Cleftlands?



2.) You are known for many things, but what would you consider your two main activities in the SCA?


Probably teaching and service. Teaching is my very favorite thing to do, because I'm just so happy and excited to share things with others, and service is just natural to me. If I'm not busy doing something, I start to feel restless, and most of my service feeds into my teaching, and vice versa.

3.) Is there an SCA activity that you'd like to try but haven't yet?

The next thing I'm trying to get more into is heraldry, specifically name research. I think names are really cool, and choosing a name is such a big part of finding your place in the SCA that I want to be able to contribute to it.

Even though I had moved, I had spent enough years in Flaming Gryphon that when I was recognized as a Pelican, I was offered the Flaming Gryphon Legacy Pelican medallion to wear. By now, it's a little battered by time, but it's been worn by all the Pelicans made from Flaming Gryphon since AS 29 (1994). I was the 21st to wear it, and it's difficult to express the way it feels to join a noble lineage like that. Many of those who came before me were people I looked up to when I started out in the SCA. It's since been passed down several more times and I may never get to hold it again, but that medallion will always be special. Cleftlands did not share a similar tradition for the Pelicans that anyone I talked to could remember, so I got a medallion specifically to pass on to the next Cleftlands Pelican after me.

Random Period Object - Cleveland Museum of Art



Vulture Headdress Inlay; Egypt, Ptolemaic Dynasty; 100-1 BC

Size: About 1.25 x 1"

Gold with semi-precious stones adhered with resin.

This piece is made to represent a vulture headdress, something worn in depictions of goddesses and queens. It contains more than 100 stones, many set in their own partition to keep the detail of the piece more precise. You can see the body, wing, and tail feathers were carefully distinguished. This piece would have required incredible patience and skill to craft.

The stones include lapis lazuli, turquoise, petrified wood, as well as an unidentified white stone.
