Dressed to Kill II: A 14th Century Day and Cleftlands Investiture

This past Saturday, April 9, saw the second event to happen in the Cleftlands since February 2020: the Dressed to Kill II Armorers and Needleworkers Symposium - and Baronial Investiture. It was a day of scholarship and pageantry, with the focus on the clothing and armor of the 14th century. Classes ranged from arming points to bycockets, indigenous regalia to plate armor, so there was something for all

A brief morning court was called by Their Majesties where a new law was read - and the Barony's newest Laurel was put on vigil. Baroness - now Good Mistress - Angharad did not know this was coming, as she was the Herald of the Court at the time. Baroness Constanza and Master Aiden knelt to beg the boon, to the shock of Good Mistress Angharad. As court ended, she was whisked off to her vigil, prepared in advance for her by her many friends.



When not attending classes, the populace area was packed with friends reconnecting for the first time in years, artisans practicing their skills on the Craftsperson's Green, and music being made by the Cleftlands ensemble. Crafts on display included bone needles, arrow making, gold-work, and more. Friends came to congratulate the soon-to-be Laurel in her vigil area, complete with snacks that would be the envy at a Royal feast (as is appropriate for a cooking Laurel!).

Before court in the evening, a fashion show displayed the range of garb worn by attendees. While the 14th century was the theme, clothing from all throughout Society period made its way down the runway. Much applause was granted to these brave fashionistas.



Then began court as the Barony welcomed the sixth Baron and Baroness of the Cleftlands - Pietro Nicolo da San Tebaldo and Aurelia Rosetti. They processed with banners flying, tossing chocolate coins to the crowd. Music played, people cheered, and Dame Ursula Mortimer recited a poem praising the Cleftlands lineage - read it at the end of this issue!

As they relinquished the coronets, Baron Crispin and Baroness Gianna received the thanks of a grateful Crown in the form of a court Barony, as is tradition. Many more awards were given out that night. Congratulations to Cleftlanders Lord Robert atte Northclyfe for his Dragon's Heart, and Lady

Jaquelinne de la Deicier and Lady Claricia de la Mere who received their second Purple Frets.

Then came the elevation of Baroness Angharad to the Laurel. Dame Alys, Baron Ephraim, and Baroness Alda all spoke to her virtues. As she was elevated, she was given a golden wrap with laurel leaves, and a cape embroidered with laurel leaves as well. Each leaf on the cape was handmade by a friend.

The evening closed with many joining in to clean and evacuate the site right on time. Much gratitude to Sir Farbegn Rinksson, Event Steward, and his awesome staff. If you missed the event, you missed a lot!

A Few More Than Five Questions - Get to Know Our New Baron and Baroness

The sixth Baron and Baroness (or, as they prefer Barone and Baronessa) of the Cleftlands sat down and answered a few questions about their SCA experience, preferences, where to get cookies at Pennsic, and a few other things that will be good to know!

1.) How did you first get involved in the SCA?

I was a Tolkien nerd and a friend in high school with similar tastes suggested that I come along to a meeting of this "sort of similar thing" down on CWRU campus. That was 1983-4, IIRC. Things get hazy - that was a different millennium.

2.) What are your two main activities in the SCA?

Archery. I have a crossbow on loan with which I've shot for war points, and in my "Pending Projects Pile" is a white oak crossbow stock blank. It just needs forming, inlay, finishing, hardware, a prod, binding, a string, bolts and a quiver. So, any day now, right?

4.) What are your favorite foods?

I admit to being partial to mustards and horseradish sauces, generally on roasted meats. I'm an omnivore. Beverage-wise, I like a good mead. I am open to being educated about good spirits. I prefer ales and stouts to IPAs, but I won't say no to any good brew. Life is too short to drink cheap beer.

6.) What are your least favorite foods, or any food restrictions (allergies, etc.)?

I'm an omnivore with no known allergies. (Knock on wood.) My tolerance for extreme spicy heat is...limited.

7.) Where do you camp at Pennsic?

Newbridge Encampment (the encampment that is NOT Sir Ephraim's household). We're on the Serengeti. Stop by - we have cookies.

8.) Do you have a favorite SCA-period movie or TV series?

I think, like most rapier combatants, I'm a sucker for "The Princess Bride". Also, "A Lion In Winter".

9.) Tell us about your pets!

Doorknocker with Gorgon Head. Mid 1500s, Venice, Italy.

Bronze casting

~10" x 7.75" x ~2.75" - https://www.clevelandart.org/art/1972.1

A doorknocker designed to impress, this one was made for a Venetian palace. Snakes coil from the figure's head, indicating the person depicted is likely Medusa, a Gorgon from Greek mythology. It was said that a Gorgon's head could protect from evil.

The choice to depict this figure on the front door was likely made to evoke a guarding function. The goose symbol could be the heraldry for the owners of the house.
