Black Nag (3 couples in a line)	
Verse 1	Double forward and back. Repeat
Chorus 2	C1: 4 slips up, then C2, then C3. All turn C3: 4 slips down, then C2, then C3. All turn
Verse 2	Side over right shoulder, then left
Chorus 2	M1 & W3 switch, W1 & W3, then C2. All turn M1 & W3 switch, W1 & W3, then C2. All turn
Verse 3	Arm by right arm, then by left
Chorus 3	Men hey for 3, then all turn. Women likewise
C1,2,etc	Couple 1,2,etc
M1,2,etc	Man in first position, second, etc
W1,2,etc	Woman in first position, second, etc

Challenge Sword

This spring Caius gifted the Barony with a wooden challenge sword, charging Baron Edward with issuing a challenge to his fellow landed Barons at Northern Oaken. Baron Edward did so, and the challenge was well received and judged by Their Majesties. However, many members of our populace are still mystified about how to properly use the sword.

The idea of using a wooden sword to issue a challenge comes from a period source; a book of the tournament. In it the person holding the tournament sends a wooden sword to a knight as an invitation/challenge to enter the tournament.

To use the Baronial challenge sword:

First, approach the Baron and Baroness to make sure your challenge is acceptable and collect the sword from them. You should include who it is you are challenging and have someone in mind to judge the challenge.

Second, take the challenge sword and present it to the person you are challenging stating your challenge

Third, if the challenger accepts the sword and presents it to a person who represents virtue (usually a Lady), they have accepted the challenge. If there are multiple challengers, the Lady would then return the sword to the person who issued the challenge so that s/he can present it to the next challenger.

Finally, after the challenge is completed, return the sword to the Baron and Baroness
