

Shall We Dance?

Saltarello La Regina

Saltarellos are a dance form found in Europe from the 13th to the 14th century, which later involved into a saltarello dance step, commonly used in 15th century Italian dance. Saltarello la Regina is a dance originally choreographed by Geffrei Louarn de Kaermeriadec based on what is known about the 13-14th century saltarellos and some etchings of dancers, to the tune of 'Saltarello in C', which found in a late 14th century manuscript from northern Italy.

Saltarellos were apparently distinguished by singles that consist of 'step-hop' and doubles of 'step-step-step-hop.' As you can tell once you've danced it, those are all the steps in the saltarello

S=Single (assume forward unless specified)

D=Double

out=away from partner in=towards partner

Chorus: D; S out, S in, D backwards Verse 1: S, S, Chorus

S, S, Chorus

Verse 2: Men turn toward partner with S, S
Women turn toward partner with S, S, *Chorus*Women turn toward partner with S, S

Men turn toward partner with S, S, *Chorus*

Verse 3: Men dance around partner with S, S, S, S

Women dance around partner with S, S, S, S, Chorus

Women dance around partner with S, S, S, S

Men dance around partner with S, S, S, S, Chorus

Verse 4: Partners take right hands and turn twice with S, S, S, S, S, S, Chorus
Partners take left hands and turn twice with S, S, S, S, S, S, S
