A Regular Event That Isn't

The origins of the first Regular Event on January 28, 1995: [Baron] Ephraim here, on the subject of Regular Event. Before we started doing Regular Event, we'd done excellent large events (like Coronations). But it had been a few years, and we were mostly doing specialty A&S events, and local events like Standard Bearer's. I was a heavy-weapons fighter bemoaning to myself the absence of January events that included tournaments. Lots of peaceful events nearby, but no combat.

So I thought, let's put on the event ourselves. I wanted a "regular" event, which at the time I thought of as a heavy tourney (fencing was still young in the Kingdom), a feast, and dancing after. So I volunteered to be Autocrat (what we called the person in charge of the event at the time), and wondered whether I'd be scrambling all day. [Duke] Laurelen told me he didn't see any reason I wouldn't be able to participate, and he was right.

My big lesson from the day was that the best approach as an Event Steward is to assemble a team of good people and then stay the heck out of the way - the only problems I recall arose from my micromanaging where I should have let smart people do what they were good at. A lesson well learned, I hope.

We'd planned for 250 people, and were snug at the roughly 350 that showed up despite daytime temperature in the teens, and had a very successful event. And through the greater vision and more expert execution of many leaders since then, the Regular Event has grown to something truly exemplary. Seems all we needed was to claim a time on the calendar (which no one else was clamoring for at the time) for Cleftlanders with good ideas to establish a tradition that makes me proud to be a part of a Barony with such energy, creativity, and diversity of ideas.

From one of our current Regular Event Stewards, THL Jolicia atte Northclyfe: Over the past 10 years, Regular Event has grown from a mostly local affair to a major date on the Middle Kingdom calendar. The event regularly hosts the reigning Majesties and/or Highnesses, along with various peerage meetings and A&S displays. Often it is one of the first big events on the yearly calendar that has armored combat, so heavy and rapier fighters are eager to get back on the lists.

Thanks to the Barony's hard working and talented members, the event has gained a reputation for being well-managed and offering a wide variety of martial, A&S, youth, bardic, and other activities. Everyone from a newcomer at their first event to a seasoned fighter can find a full day of excitement.

Regular Event feasts are legendary, thanks to our amazing Cooks' Guild. Our feasts are usually sell-out affairs with multiple courses and surprising temptations for the head table. There are always lots of leftovers to take home to enjoy the next day.

Work on a large event like Regular Event starts months earlier with the presentation of a bid to the Baronial officers, and selection of the main department heads. Cleftlands is lucky to have so many members who bring years of experience to these jobs, but we like to tap a few new people who want to learn the ropes. Think about volunteering for this year's event!

There are meetings and site walk-throughs during the months leading up to the event. Plans change as late word arrives of another Royal or peer meeting that we will be hosting, or last-minute changes at the site mean we will have less space than anticipated. The day's schedule is posted on the event website, the site flier is proof-read and printed, and site tokens are created.

The actual event starts the night before, when the event committee and helpers begin setting up the site. We do as much as we can then, so chairs and tables are set up, the cooks' supplies are carried in, the lists and royalty rooms are made ready, and room signs are put up. Bathrooms are checked for cleanliness. We find out where to get more TP and garbage bags.

Event day starts in the pre-dawn hours, when the parking attendant sets up signs designating spaces for Royalty and the head cooks before anyone else arrives. The road signs that help out-of-towners find the site are set at strategic intersections. The people in charge of Gate set up their tables with cash boxes and tokens.

We only have about two hours to scurry around putting final touches on things before the public starts to arrive. Merchants arrive early and need to be directed to their area. The coffee urn is heated up. With about 15 minutes to go until doors open, anyone not yet in garb is gently reminded that it's time to change.

Once the event starts, there is actually very little for the autocrats to do except answer questions and make sure all the departments are running smoothly. After Gate closes, the money is counted and attendance tallied up. The day goes by fast until the final room flips for court and feast. Then it's time to break everything down, pack up, and return the rooms to their previous condition. That means lugging heavy tables and chairs, sweeping floors, cleaning the kitchen, and more. Cleftlanders are proud of our reputation for always leaving a site cleaner than we found it.

The event stewards are the last to leave the site, usually close to midnight, exhausted but happy that the Barony can boast of another successful Regular Event.





The Founding of the Cleftlands Cooks' Guild - A Reading from the Annals of the Cleftlands Kitchen (Regular Event 2018: 40th Anniversary)

In those days, there was called to be, in the March of the Cleftlands, an Event. Many were invited, from all over the Known world, to attend this event, and many of them came. In preparation for the Event, the populace of the Cleftlands, as yet new to the practices of hospitality, searched their minds as to how to make these many guests welcome. For them they planned tourney, and dances and other entertainments, and they planned a Feast.

In the absence of dirt, and all those things that accompany dirt, such as well-equipped home kitchens, chest freezers, and the like, the populace chose to ask the great and noble feast man, Pickle Bill of the Lake, to provide provender for this feast. These cooks then compared the First Number to the Second Number. And then they looked at the salmon, and peas, and the other foods provided by Pickle Bill of the Lake. And then there was groaning indeed, not from the sideboard, but from the kitchen, as they discovered that the Second Number was, by far, the greater Number.

They divided the fish, and the peas, and the other provender among the guests, and invited them to eat. But these loaves and fishes did not increase themselves to satisfy the guests of the Cleftlands, and many among the guests that day left the Cleftlands saying "Great event, but could we stop at McDonald's on the way home?"

The heads of the populace hung low with shame until a few among them took council, then came to swear a mighty oath: "With the Dragon as our witness, they shall never go hungry again!" And when this great vow was heard, the River Cuyahoga itself burst into flame to provide them cooking fires, and the mighty stacks of the mills of Mordor's Steelyard obscured the sun with smoke to make them knives and pots.

Today's feast is a remembrance of the past of the Guild, a journey from the early days of simpler stews, through the saffron rice of a later age, and into our more current history. We hope you enjoy it, and that you will leave groaning.



Panels like this one were made to cover the head of the mummified figure that they represent. Everything was depicted in detail, from the skin tone and facial features, to the hair style and jewelry. This painting was dated in part due to the hairstyle shown, which was popular during the reign of Emperor Tiberius (14-37 AD).

This figure adds gilding to the lips and on the jewelry, showing that the person was transformed into an akh - a being of light, or blessed spirit.

Sometimes paintings were done directly onto the linen shrouds, many of which did not survive the passage of time.

Archeology News: Historic Smells, Lithuanian Lake Skeletons, a Turkey Feather Blanket, and a 15th Century Text Rediscovered

New facts about the ancient, Medieval, and Renaissance worlds are continually being discovered. Here is a selection of the latest developments from the world of medieval archeology:

How the Past Smelled: Historians, scientists, perfumers, and museums across Europe are collaborating on a project that aims to capture everyday odors in Europe between the 16th and early 20th centuries. The three-year project is called "Odeuropa."

Researchers want to find or recreate all the old scents of Europe — dry tobacco, medicinal herbs, smelly canals, tanneries, forges, and more. They will first build artificial intelligence trained to scan historical documents in seven languages for descriptions of odors and images of objects that have odors. This information will be used to create an online encyclopedia of smells from Europe's past.

Skeleton Found in Lake Bottom: More than 500 years ago, a medieval soldier's dead body lay hidden beneath sand and silt at the bottom of a Lithuanian lake. Now, the submerged skeleton has been discovered during an underwater inspection of a bridge in eastern Lithuania's Lake Asveja.

Researchers believe the person was male, died in the 16th century, and was in the military due to weapons and other items found near the body. The cause of death is unknown.

Turkey Feather Blanket Analyzed: Researchers from Washington State University have analyzed a turkey feather blanket thought to have been crafted by 13th century Ancestral Pueblo people living in the American Southwest.

The blanket, measuring about 42 inches long and 39 inches wide, was created by wrapping about 11,500 downy feathers around nearly 200 yards of yucca fiber cord. Craftspersons would have needed feathers from as many as 10 turkeys to produce a blanket of this size. The feathers were probably collected from domesticated turkeys when they molted.

Lost Text Rediscovered: Rochester Institute of Technology students used an imaging system they developed as freshmen to uncover lost writing on 15th-century manuscript leaves.

Ultraviolet-fluorescence imaging revealed that a manuscript leaf was actually a palimpsest, or a manuscript on parchment containing multiple layers of writing. French cursive writing appeared when the manuscript was scanned with the ultraviolet-fluorescence imaging technique. In the 15th century, parchment was regularly scraped or erased so it could be reused. While the erased text is invisible to the naked eye, it can be detected using other parts of the light spectrum.
