# Dancers Lay Siege to Squire's Castle

Saturday June 30th rain clouds threatened, but by 10 am the sun was shining through much to the relief of the Cleftlands Dance Guild which gathered at the Cleveland Metropark's Squire's Castle for what was jokingly referred to as the first meeting of the Cleftlands Film Society.

Along with their best garb, the dancers brought friends and props to make the old gatehouse a castle indeed for the talented camera of their director, Hely D'Isigny. There were eight committed dancers as well as several extras including the dramatic Aurore De Vie, the becoming Branwyn FitzPayne with her spinning wheel and the ever elegant Lady Sarra Bossard. A few quick establishing shots of the castle's inhabitants going about their picturesque routine and the music began. Karl Von Kohn's violin lead a merry band of dancers out of the castle for the first dance, Bransle Pinagay. Many of the extras who had not specifically intended to dance joined in for the simple french dance. Several times through to get all the right shots and the Cleftlanders retreated inside once more to break for a celebratory picnic lunch.

A sumptuous repast of period and



non-period snackables had the dancers in good cheer when bad news struck... wedding guests! There was to be a wedding in the castle that afternoon. An unavoidable occurrence on a beautiful June Saturday at the Castle which cannot be reserved but is available for public use. The dancers scrambled to step through Manschaft Pavanne quickly and to get themselves and their props out of the way of the wedding, which to the delight of all was held in medieval garb.

After Manschaft Pavanne, the dancers traipsed out the back door of the Castle and onto a free square of lawn to continue dancing. The wedding guests were not at all inconvenienced and several of them actually enjoyed watching the guild do one last run through of Bransle Pinagay for close-up shots.

The final dance, Chestnut, was danced well away from the castle and out of the traffic pattern of the two more wedding parties which showed up to have their pictures taken with the castle. Requiring only six dancers, the rest of the extras lounged in the background an attractive audience. Lady Aurore was pleased to inform the director she was 'ready for her close up'.

By three thirty there were three dances done and filmed and the exhausted party finally stripped off top layers of garb and lounged in the shade... as the skies finally opened up in a sprinkle of rain. The timing could not have been more perfect... the rain let up in time for the dancers to adjourn to a local ice cream shop to toast the filming's success with triple scoops and root beer floats.

The idea for a video of medieval

dancing was born a few months earlier by Hely d'Isigny at a Guild meeting, but none could have imagined just how much fun the project would be. Hoobahs and cheers to all, in particular Lord Timothy who acted as Assistant Director and kept everything running smoothly.

The final purpose of the video, other than the personal enjoyment of those who participated, is likely to be for demonstrations or perhaps for teaching dance. The final video will probably not be long, less than 20 minutes, and may have additional computer animation added explaining dance steps. Right now the director is mostly concerned with the credits sequence and coming up with a catchy title. Former Premier Dancer Lady Vashti suggests "Sunday in the Park with the Cleftlands", Edward Brackenburye, being the only Squire in attendance at the shoot, felt that the name of the Castle was important to include.

If the final product is successful, there is talk of doing another video for the Scribe's Guild. Of course, the participants feel that the project has been successful regardless of how the film turns out.
