## Pennsic: Things to Do There and at Home

The war started with the Midrealm. At least, that's how the legend goes. The tale goes something like this, depending on whom you ask: King Cariadoc of the Middle wanted to engage in battle with the East Kingdom, and sent a declaration of war. They did not take him up on this, so the King took matters into his own hands by moving to the East and becoming King there. In A.S. VII (1972) he found the very declaration that he sent East when he was the Midrealm King - and accepted. He led his armies west, but was defeated by his former forces. The stakes? The loser had to maintain the Barony of the Debatable Lands (Pittsburgh, PA).

To know how much of this is true, you'll have to ask someone who was there!

# **Archery Ranges for Nebbles: Part 1**

There are an excellent number of ranges on which to practice archery around and near our Baronial territory. This is the first of several articles offering places where one might go to practice their bowmanship.

I'll first cite that there are indoor archery ranges in the area, such as the upstairs space at the Parma Armory. This can be useful in the winter months, but all of these places will charge you an hourly fee – when I last visited the Parma Armory, it was \$18 per hour (there are annual memberships available). Maximum distance for shooting in the Parma range is 35 yards – the animal targets are easily wheeled to the sides. Note that they insisted I use the special higher-density butts made for crossbows, despite my pointing out that my bow was

an 80-pound draw – less than some of the compound hand bows they were hosting. They then added another \$5 per hour because, crossbow.

For those of us on a tighter budget, and wishing the pleasant company and support of fellow SCAdians, I highly recommend attending the practice at the home of Foresters Gwyneth and Muldonny. Their backyard accommodates a 45-yard shoot, and the 35-yard line can handle 6 archers at once (even with a rotund old crossbowman in a chair). Bonus: you are guaranteed a certified marshal on site, so points can and will count! Watch our Baronial FB postings for announcements of upcoming practices.

Alternately, Brendoken archers have been using the Hampton Hills Archery Range for their practices. Just a few miles west of the Blossom Music Center in part of the Summit Metro Parks, the well-maintained field accommodates shooting to 50 yards from at least 8 shooting posts along each of two neighboring lines. There are handy picnic tables, "bow-hanger" posts, and a nearby restroom. Check with the Brendoken archery announcements regarding their practice schedule (or contact their marshal THL Saradwen/Sally Burnell) on Facebook. Or you can shoot there any day from 6 a.m. to dusk, should you choose. Hampton Hills Archery Range, 1940 W. Steels Corners Rd., Cuyahoga Falls

## Random Period Object - Cleveland Museum of Art



Knife Sheath, Korea, 1100s CE

Size: About 8.5" long

Gilt silver with a brass ring.

A jangdo was a small dagger that was worn with everyday clothes and carried for self defense. Both men and women used them - men wore them openly on their coat strings or at the waist, while women carried them in pockets or the outer collar of their jackets.

They were often objects of fashion, and subject to several bans or other official restrictions over the years. In the late 16th and early 17th centuries, the jangdo became a symbol of women's chastity.

This particular example is the sheath only, and was likely displayed as a luxury item. The decorations are of dragons and phoenixes with floral bands.
