Monday 05 August (War Week) - Noon - Rapier Company muster at the Camp of the Three Bears for a 12:30 march to the Rapier Town/Cathedral Battle (1 pm)

Thursday 08 August (War Week) - 9:30 am - Archery Company muster at the Camp of the Three Bears for a 10 am march(ride) to the Archery Field. (This conflicts with the Armored Woods Battle.)

Thursday 08 August - 6 pm - Middle Kingdom Court in the Middle Kingdom Battlefield Tent. Arrive early, bring your own chairs.

Friday 09 August (War Week) - 9 am - Armored Company muster at the Camp of the Three Bears for a 9:30 march to the Armored Field Battle.

Friday 09 August - 4 pm - Meet on the Battlefield to drop and fold the Baronial Tent.

Come home prepared to share a tale or a boast of great deeds you witnessed at the War!

What It's Like to Enter a Kingdom A&S Faire

On Saturday of Memorial Day Weekend, I packed up bright and early to drive to the Hancock County Fairgrounds in Findlay, Ohio, for Kingdom A&S. Against a changeable sky, I saw a fat rainbow over verdant fields, a good sign for the day to come, wherein I would be entering my silk bliaut in the competition.

The fairground was also hosting a flea market that day, and a few food booths as one would expect to see at a fair. The mood was bustling and happy as I found a parking spot and headed to the Arts and Sciences area, clearly denoted by the familiar candle in a window banner. We had a fair barn to use, with tables set up all along the sides for entrants, marked with little red flags with numbers. I chose number 18 as a lucky one and set down my things, taking my garb to the nearby restroom building to change.

The restrooms were fairground restrooms, regretfully rustic, but they did the trick as far as providing a modesty screen, and at least they did have a few mirrors.

I decided instead of wearing another dress and changing into my bliaut for judging to just wear the gown all day. At first this seemed a poor decision, as the temperature rose quickly, already past 80°F at 9am. Still, while my silk gown was unpleasantly insulating, it was also breathable, and idleness was enough to keep me comfortable.

The organization of the face-to-face judging for 25 entrants with, if I heard correctly, over 45 entries, took a little more time than expected, but the competition was underway with the first judging block at 10:30. I wasn't being judged until 12:30 so I took the opportunity to check out the flea market, which was full of fun and interesting items, then the Publick House, which was cozily situated in its own picnic shelter right outside the larger barn that would hold court, and already buzzing with a small group of people talking, a musician playing a guitar, and various crafts being worked on.

The main barn had the SCA merchants, a nice selection thereof, and some lovely day camps. This included the "crafter's green" which had plentiful space for various activities, including a full-size loom and two spinning wheels, a display of a collection of facsimile books of hours, and more. All of the gentler arts were well on display.

I returned to my table a little early and found two judges already there, reading over the documentation packets I'd left. We got to talking... and kept talking until it was actually time to be judged! It felt more like a conversation about the project than "judging."

I felt good, and unconcerned for my score, because, I reminded myself, I had already won the best prize: I get to keep this dress.

I moved on to my stint as a judge, and passed another pleasant hour discussing other people's work. I got to judge a piece with Sir Crispin, who was serving in his capacity as regional A&S Minister. Overall, my impression was that the competition went smoothly. The only griping about

judging I heard was judges relating stories of their own bad experiences in years past!

Soon it was time to break down the A&S hall and prepare for court! The spacious hall, again where the merchants and Crafter's Green had been, was kept cool with plentiful fans. The Baronage processed in, and were well represented, our own Pietro and Aurelia joined by nearly every other barony in the Kingdom! (One friend speculated that there were three missing?)

At court, Paul of Cleftlands received his AoA for his many enthusiastic actions.

The results of the A&S Faire were announced, and your humble baronial arts champion had the second highest score! Third place was also a piece from our region, the fabulous native clay Brendoaken oven made by Lady Eleanore van Tyne, apprentice to our dear Baronnessa! There was no shame in not taking first place when it went to the exquisite hand-forged chain made for the newest lady knight of the Midrealm! That piece deservedly got a perfect score of 30 out of 30!

As the shadows lengthened and the heat cooled, I headed home, regretting I could not stay for Sunday's tournament. I know from photos shared that the fighting took place in the large barn. Cleftlands was well represented on the lists with Mistress Constanza and Countess Nessa both fighting for on the Crown List, for Baron Callum and Earl Winthegn respectively, and Sir Crispin reprising his appearance on the list for the honor of Baroness Gianna.

There's No Place Like NOWM - The 26th Northern Oaken War Maneuvers Event Delights All Once Again

On June 8th, Cleftlands' held the beloved summer event, Northern Oaken War Maneuvers (NOWM), for the 26th time. Once again, the event was fortunate in the weather, which was warm but not unbearable, with clear skies and sun. Tsar Ivan and Tsaritsa Katalena presided over the field, where heavy and rapier fighters spent the day practicing the arts of war.

One of the best aspects of NOWM, other than the beautiful site, is that there is something for everyone. Melees on the field, classes under the pavilion, any number of merchants, a craftsperson's green, bocce tournament, Royal Court - and, of course, pirogies for lunch!

Speaking of court, multiple Cleftlanders were called up to be recognized for their deeds. Lord Günther Arnbach and Lord Ladislas "Vlad" Vulcu were both inducted into the Order of the Cavendish Knot (for those who have shown proficiency on the field of rapier combat or exemplary service in furthering such field). The Honorable Noble Ragna stórráða Úlfsdóttir joined the Order of the Willow, and Their Excellencies Clairiel du Vent Argent and Ealdred of Gwyntarian were given a Royal Augmentation of Arms. This means that they can add a specific symbol to their heraldry, by Royal decree. In this case, the symbol is a goutte sanguine, or a drop of blood.

A new holder of the NOBLE Cup was also announced: Sgt. Patraic O Dochartaigh. "NOBLE" stands for "North Oaken Bardic Lagniappe of Excellence" and the cup is awarded to the winner of a bardic competition amongst participants from the North Oaken region.

There were other recognitions as well, including the winner of the annual bocce tournament - although unfortunately this reporter could only hear the name as "Matthew." Also, the North Oaken Regional Archery champion is Master Edward!

At the end of the day, our Baronial Exchequer, THL Robert, reported that 447 people attended the event, and the barony even made a profit: \$1945.52.

This past weekend, we received word of a potential change of plan for Fall Coronation at the Kingdom level. Due to their Highnesses' distance from our planned site (they live in the Chicago area, 7.5 hours from our site), it had been requested that Coronation be held closer to their home Barony.

Since then, we have been working with our Seneschal, Jolicia, and Kingdom officers to work out a plan to keep Coronation at Cleftlands, but unfortunately it has ultimately been decided at the Kingdom level to move the event to Constellation, in the Indiana area.

Please know this change has nothing to do with Cleftlands or the event bid itself; I quote the Kingdom Seneschal in saying "The bid from the Barony of Cleftlands was exceptional as always, which is no doubt why it was approved months ago. The main issue is the distance of the location from Their Highnesses. It would mean a great deal to them to have their families and many of their local friends attend. Unfortunately the Cleftlands bid would put the event 7.5 hours away.

The Barony of Cleftlands always has exceptional hospitality, and I sincerely apologize for any hardship or issues this places on the group."

Cast bronze, engraved, gilded and chased

At first glance this looks like it could be Baba Yaga's hut or Howl's moving castle, this is meant to depict a Christian/Catholic church. The four "towers" are apses, and the center is a lantern tower. Lantern towers are the tall structures built at the junction of the four arms of a cross-shaped church, so that the light that comes through the windows will shine down in the center.

Why it has dragon feet, however, is unknown; but the open turret in the center (on top of the lantern tower) suggests that it may also have been a stand for altar crosses.

One theory about this piece is that it was made to be used in a traveling court, so that it could serve multiple purposes and be easy to transport.

Event Reports from the Baronial Exchequer

Curious about how the recent Cleftlands events fared? THL Robert atte Northclyfe has shared the latest figures.

As mentioned on page 3, NOWM recorded 447 attendees. Of those, 25 were children. This is a more costly event, and the reported expenses were \$2385.52. Because of the large attendance, though, the profit was still \$1945.52.

At the Standard Bearers/North Oaken A&S Faire (headed by THL Tarmach, Lady Genevra, and Baron Crispin) event held on April 13, 113 total people attended: 112 adults and one child. After reported expenses of \$641.69, the group made \$120.82.

Fletchings of Spring, Cleftlands' annual archery event run by THL Tarmach, was held on May 18. A total of 43 people attended, all adults. Reported expenses were \$253.04, and the group made \$88.69.
