

Coronation of Ragnvaldr and Arabella a Success

The stormy weather of earlier in the week abated, and the sun shone down its glory on Cleftlands September 22nd as the noble populace of the Midrealm convened at the Bohemian National Hall to witness the coronation of Ragnvaldr and

Arabella.

An estimated 655 gentles passed through the gate under Gate Keeper Lady Celeste's auspices, each receiving a rune stone token crafted by Lord Bastian. The forward-thinking staff posted signs explaining the meanings of the runes throughout the hall, as well as maps to help event-goers find their way around the historic building.

Of those attending, we had over 80 fighters, more than 70 of whom participated in the Coronation Tourney. There were many great fights during the afternoon, each giving his all in every contest. Baron Sir Diloun of the Middle Marches was the victor of the Coronation Tourney.

There was also a Children's Tourney, for which 38 fighters

signed up. Before the tourney began, the fighters assembled in the list. Their names were read off and each received a fighting favor from the children, who had worked all morning under Lady Marsaili's supervision to create them. After more great fighting, and cheers from their small patrons, Sir Diloun once again proved victorious on the field. The kids presented him a lovely ceramic box with a dragon on the top. Marsaili

has asked that her thanks be conveyed to all the fighters for a gracious and chivalrous display that inspired and excited the children greatly.

As if this was not enough fighting to glorify a coronation, His Majesty held a list taking on all comers, and some combatants took BARDOLPH RAGNVALDR ARABELLA BRIGH advantage of the gorgeous weather to set up a training list outside. When asked at the end of the day if they had gotten

enough fighting, the fighters replied (after very slowly getting up) that they had in fact had all the fighting they could handle and more.

In addition to making favors for their tournament, the children at the event also crafted gifts for Their Majesties, a memory box decorated with fleur-de-lis and a journal decorated with the King and Queen's arms for Them to write Their experiences in throughout Their reign, which was

presented to Their Majesties at feast, and reportedly well received.

Ser Nick also organized a boffer list and tournament, providing ample entertainment all around for our kingdom's younger members.

Lady Lie organized a game of sheep herding which was popular with the children as well. Each constructed a small 'flock' from foam balls, cotton, and gewgaws, and then herded them along the floor by kicking them, the goal being to get all your sheep safely to the finish.

For those not fighting or shuffling foam sheep along, there was that most popular of SCA activities: shopping! Organized by Maria Vincente de Castilla. Shoppers didn't go hungry, either, thanks to the efforts of Lady Ceinwen and her lunch kitchen staff. There were indeed so many activities that even if there hadn't been two courts, no attendee could say there was a dull moment.

Morning court saw Conrad Shwartzwulf entered into the Order of the Gold Mace, as well as the significant business of crowning our new king. Ragnvaldr processed in with an armed guard, declaring that it was as important to protect the peace as to fight the war. "Yes," said Bardolph, "But I'm worried about your *enthusiasm*."

There were two Arts and Sciences competitions at Coronation. The first was a "melee" of sorts- those entering the competition were asked if they were authorized combatants in the SCA (all styles) or if they were non-combatants. At the end of the day, the number of entries from each team was counted, with the group with the most entries declared winner. Proving that our area boasts more than the stereotypical 'stick jocks', the combatants won the competition with 14 entries to the non-combatants 11.

Of course, Cleftlands was well-represented in the entries, including beaded necklaces by Ladies Seadna and Alex, Ursula's blue-and-white nebuly socks entered for her by Donasian, and a blue-and-white nebuly tablet-woven belt with tiny red and gold tassels for flames entered by Clariel. Stephan von Lubeck's coat of plates and Berhardt's basket hilt added a military touch to the otherwise gentle arts contributed by their fellow combatants.

There was also a fashion show held during the afternoon, with much silliness and pomp. Lady Clariel won, but she suspects the judges were biased.

Across the great hall from these fashionable pursuits, a spirited rapier tournament organized by Vincent Furnier was fought. Again, each combatant gave his all, but our own Lady Lie shined over all her opponents to win the tourney.

Classes were well-attended, particularly the one on Viking ships.

Lady Milesent coordinated 12 classes in areas throughout the event site, many of which were taught by local gentles. Serena taught about raising silkworms, Kitt lectured on the roles of women in the medieval church, Edward FitzRanulf taught about medieval warfare, and



Kathryn ferch Rhys instructed in dance, Lyonnete spoke on the evolution of medieval headgear and Seadna taught glass bead making, a class that was so popular with its students, they found it hard to put the blow torches down and attend feast.

Said feast was a triumph itself, sold out, as is usual with Cleftlands feasts, and featuring enough food to make the very floorboards groan from the weight. The cooks' guild had prepared their own sausages, which were very tasty, and ravioli's, which were, in fact, German. The theme of the feast was German, to honor our recently dethroned king, with all the recipes documented and set out on the tables. In addition to the sausages, head cooks Angharad and Francesca provided chicken, roast beef, herb tarts (a sort of spinach-quiche type of dish) and many fruit dishes, all with the help of the usual suspects. For desert there were funnel cakes (surprisingly period!) garnished with adorable mushrooms of marzipan.

Aethelstan served as Master of Ceremonies throughout the meal, heralding the courses, introducing the entertainers and announcing the winners of the day's contests. His loud, clear voice was also heard as a part of the storytellers' guild's skit on the history of Vikings. The serving staff could each hear a line or two, and every one of them was funny, and repeated back in the kitchen. Aethelstan, Aurore, Timothy, Shlomo, Pietro, Karl, Vashti, and Sarra are certainly to be commended for their performance. We also saw two Middle Eastern dancers, Karl's violin, and Edward Brackenburye's bagpipes. In addition to all this fine entertainment, a group of chamber musicians sat near the stage, playing music throughout the evening.

It was a delicious feast, and a fun one both to view and to serve. Their former majesties, Bardolph and Brigh, joined in to serve high table with Rutgar's assistance. Kathryn ferch Rhys organized servers.

The evening ended with the first court of Ragnvaldr and Arabella, resplendent in red and gold costume. Many local people were recognized, to thunderous applause. Darius was called in to court and thanked for his hard work as autocrat, and also announced the proceeds from the day's auction. Originally intended for the Royal Travel Fund, the auction was re-directed to raise money for the disaster relief efforts in New York and Washington. Approximately \$1800 were raised from the sale of many fine items. The auction table was glorious and weighted down with generosity, organized by Lord Nail and watched over throughout the day. The auction itself took place outside, to permit the fighters to continue in the main gym. Hoobah to the bidders, the donors, and the staff for this outpouring of aid. There can be no greater tribute to the Midrealm and its new king than the earnest work of charity.

As always the rapier and heavy weapons combat drew the biggest crowds and the good people of Bay Village were ecstatic to throw the tissue and duct tape 'stones' Alexandra had prepared for the demo. One fighter was heard to remark that he wished he had died earlier in the melee so he could avoid being pelted by the enthusiastic crowd.

The chivalry had a good showing at the demo, recently knighted Sir Valharic beat out tough competition for Saturday's tournament, Syr Theo won on Sunday and Ser Nicholas was victorious on Monday and in a chivalrous action gave his prize to Lady Lyonnete, who had to quit the tournament early for health reasons.

Lady Brangwen Snowden ran the fencing lists and won the rapier tournament on Saturday. Sunday and Monday's competitions were won by Warder Brice Colquhoun.

Lady Sarra organized the classes for the day which unfortunately were poorly attended. There is hope that next year the classes will be better advertised.

Lady Celeste orchestrated an impromptu dance demonstration on Sunday. Many flyers were handed out, illuminations displayed and in all everyone, combatants, artisans and the public had a good time.

SCA-History: The First Coronation Held in Cleftlands

From the second written history of the Cleftlands, compiled by Isabella of Greycliffs

The Cleftlands finally got to host a kingdom event, Dagan's first coronation in the fall of 1974. Ozzie, Karen, Swami, and Maria did a lot of the planning. The day site was Squire's Castle. The tourney was to be at Thwing [CWRU campus], and the feast at Fenn Tower [CSU campus]. Almost all transportation in the Cleftlands died the week of the event. Swami had obtained a permit saying they needed no permit to use Squire's Castle, but he didn't show up at the castle with it. The police were finally somehow convinced that SCA was there legally. Dagan had his coronation and held his first court. There was some unpleasantness with Sterling van Hamm at this point. He left the SCA shortly afterwards. Due to lack of transportation and no lack of confusion, the tournament was never held. Some people, such as Maria and Yosef, never even got rides to the feast. They turned out to be the lucky ones. There were 45 feast reservations, and the cooks made enough food for 70 people. Many more than that number showed up. There was one salmon, and some bread trenchers (which in this case did not feed the multitude.) The roast suckling pig was delivered 2 hours late. A young server also managed to overturn a giant vat of peas. The event was a disaster, and earned notoriety for the Cleftlands which lasted several years.
